## Our work is valued

## **Key Idea**

When we say "our work is valued," we mean that we are paid equally for our work and get promoted equally too. The jobs primarily done by women—from teaching to caregiving and so much more—are valued and supported. And all people can retire with dignity and enjoy the life they worked hard for.

## **Key Idea**

Unions are a major way workers can fight back against inequitable pay, unfair labor practices, and exploitation. Since the pandemic, there has been a bit of a renaissance for labor organizing and a rise in membership with unions among Gen Z and Millenials.
